On October 23, 2018, I lost my father to the epidemic of suicide. Despite him not having been very present in my life, it was incredibly difficult for me to take. I began to cut myself off from my friends, be more cynical and have a very negative outlook on life. Thankfully, the Club was there to help me overcome my negativity by allowing me to interact with people who knew how to help me, and they allowed me to become a better person – the person I am today.

When I first came to the Club, I saw it as a place for kids with no place, somewhere I was sent because no one would take me; however, it became the place where I became me. The hole started to be filled as the Club nurtured and guided my personality.

During the first five years of my life, I had a tumultuous home life. My father fell deep into his drinking problem, turning to verbal and physical abuse. My home was a place riddled with holes, both literal and metaphorical. My father, in his drunken rage, often hit walls, leaving a hole. Although he didn't know it, he was also leaving holes in my heart.

I was a very quiet, reserved child. I never made many friends and was very lonely. As I spent more time at the Club, I began to make friends. As I developed relationships with the kids and staff at the Club, and I started to share my interests, I saw the Club as where I was meant to be, as somewhere that I could be accepted.

I am always looking towards my future, but I am so grateful for my past. The past is what built me, and without it, I wouldn't be who I am today. I have been a part of the Boys & Girls Club for nine years; and to me, it is more than just a place to hang out with friends, it's a place where we learn so many lessons. For me these included leadership and independence. The skills we learn don't only help us in school and at the Club, but they are lessons that will help us for the rest of our lives.

I have been able to participate in many activities with the Club that I would have never even tried if the leaders hadn't encouraged me. I wouldn't have ever strived to be the first girl to the top of the rock wall in Lander, or to ride in the front

of the raft as we rushed towards the rocks while floating the Snake River. I don't think I would be the person I am today without the leadership the Club has given me.

Growing up in a single parent home with my mother was quite difficult. She was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis when I was seven, and this has led my sister and me to learn life lessons more quickly. Recently she had a stroke, and I have had to teach her to walk and talk again. Through this, I have developed my leadership, courage and empathy.

In addition to the Club and my family, my horses have always helped me when I'm in a rough place. When I am struggling with handling everything at home, I know that there is always a place to go to clear my head and get back onto my feet again.

My passion is working with animals. They have always helped me, and I want to be a veterinarian so I can help them. I plan to get my bachelor's degree at the University of Wyoming and my doctorate in veterinary medicine. I know that I can meet each and every one of my goals. Through the courage I've gained by being a member of the Club and my personal experiences in life, I know I have the perseverance to succeed.

For Megan Degenfelder, elected Superintendent of Public Instruction for the State of Wyoming, summer evenings as a child were spent at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming's Main Club, playing in summer basketball leagues. Here, she gained confidence and leadership skills through competition.

Megan went on to become a standout athlete

in middle school, at Natrona County High School and at the University of Wyoming as captain of the Women's Rugby Club.

In 2015, when Megan was manager of Public Affairs for Cloud Peak Energy, she was instrumental in developing the first sponsorships for the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming's Young AmeriTowne:WyoTowne, which is a financial literacy center that instructs students throughout the state.

In 2017, Megan was hired as the Department of Education's Chief Policy Officer. In this role, she oversaw multiple divisions, including education standards, assessment, and the Hathaway scholarship. She remained an incredible advocate for Boys & Girls Clubs across Wyoming.

In the spring of 2022, Megan asked to announce her candidacy for Wyoming Superintendent of Public Instruction at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming's Young AmeriTowne: WyoTowne—a place that symbolized connection and leadership in her youth and where she contributed during her career in the private and public sector and gave back to the Club.

Club alumni Megan Degenfelder inspires young people that they can accomplish anything, including becoming the next Superintendent of Public Instruction for the State of Wyoming.



**PRESTON BLAKELEY**

**BGCCW Area Director**

For Preston Blakeley, a Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming Area Director, his journey with the Club began 22 years ago when he was eight years old. The Boys & Girls Club in Glenrock had just opened, and his parents needed a safe place for his brother and him to go after school. Shortly after he began attending the Club, his mother was diagnosed with a tumor in her back. She required surgery and spent the next year needing daily radiation treatment.

In Preston's own words:

"My father did everything he could to provide for our family and to make sure that our mother got the care she needed. He needed the Club so that we were safe and cared for. **FOR ME, THE CLUB WAS A REFUGE FOR MY CHILDHOOD.** Because my mom was sick, I had added responsibilities. I made sure my brother and I were up and on time to school, I had to help with the nightly duties around the house and spent my weekends helping my dad around the house. When I was at the Club, I could be a kid.

I could play games with my friends and be goofy.

As I got older, I thought my story was unique—that I was one of the only people in my generation who had to grow up too soon; but when I began working with kids, I realized how common my story is."

# CAREER WORKS

Career Works programming began in March of 2022. The program engages youth ages 12-18 in:

- Essential skill development
- Career exploration
- Work-based learning
- Skills certification activities

Career Works properly and adequately prepares youth to graduate from high school with a plan: whether it be a career path, college, technical or trade school, or the military. As future leaders of our communities, equipping youth with modern and innovative programs and technology will better prepare them for the workforce.

## E&F TOWING, TRANSPORT & RECOVERY

Teens took several learning field trips to E&F Towing, Transport, and Recovery. At these trips, they received tutorials and hands-on training about how various tools are used. They got to use various hydraulic and hand jacks, as well as impact drills, and changed a tire.



## MOSER ENERGY SYSTEMS

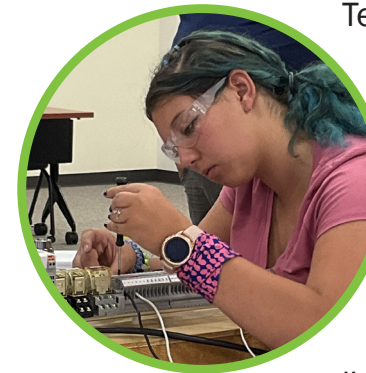
At Moser Energy Systems, teens began by doing mock interviews and job applications. In following weeks, teens rotated through stations to learn different aspects of Moser's industry. One group worked on tearing down and rebuilding engine cylinder heads, the second group helped take apart and reassemble a natural gas engine. The third group worked with 2D CAD to program a laser cutter to cut designs teens customized into metal. Finally, the last group studied the importance of supply chain and inventory.

## AUTOMATION & ELECTRONICS

Career Works programming at Automation & Electronics began with teens learning how to make circuits safely and how to build a lightbulb.



Teens spent their second and third weeks at Automation & Electronics learning how to wire a traffic light and how to program the lights to cycle through different signals.

Finally, teens wrapped up their time at Automation & Electronics wiring a three-way switch. This kind of switch is a challenge for electricians and is used to allow lights to be turned on-or-off at opposite ends of a hallway, staircase, or room. The teens rose to the challenge and accomplished the tricky task through teamwork.

## SPRUCE BEAUTY BAR

At Spruce Beauty Bar, teens received hands-on training in the different aspects of being a beauty professional: how to be a nail tech, how to braid and dye hair, how to give spray tans, and how to run a business. It was great to experience a profession that's often overlooked.



## TRANSFR VR

The Club launched the TRANSFR VR program in April 2022. This program provides youth with a virtual training facility with over 280 career simulations and 30-plus career fields, such as culinary, automotive, and construction. Since May, BGCCW has delivered career exploration to 435 middle and high school students in the Natrona and Converse County school districts using the TRANSFR VR program. Expansions to other counties and districts are planned.

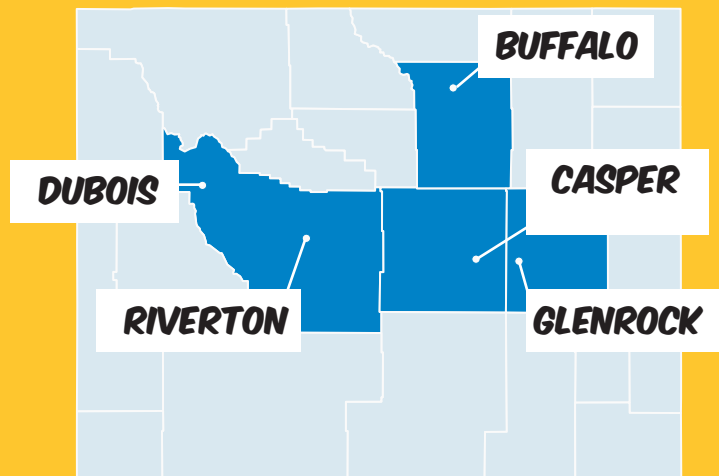

**THE BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF CENTRAL WYOMING HAS OVER 53 YEARS OF SERVICE TO YOUTH,**

providing after school and out-of-school care at 11 Club sites in four counties. Youth have access to growth opportunities, high yield learning activities, and relationship building focused on three priority outcomes: Academic Success, Healthy Lifestyles, and Good Character and Citizenship.

Daily targeted programs like Power Hour assist Club members in completing homework and extend their school-day learning into the hands-on, experiential culture of the Club. Healthy Habits and SMART Moves help young people make healthy choices for their lives, not just in what they eat or how they stay physically healthy, but also their social interactions and self-image. Programs such as Cowboy Ethics challenge youth to find their foundational values and live them in all of their endeavors. Young AmeriTowne: WyoTowne teaches financial literacy and civics.

# ATHLETICS

**LIVING A HEALTHY LIFESTYLE** is one of the three priority outcomes of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming. Sports leagues offer the opportunity to explore competitive sports while learning positive use of leisure time. Playing sports also helps reduce stress, develop social and interpersonal skills and engage in positive behaviors.

The Club offers flag football, indoor soccer, volleyball, t-ball and coach pitch.

## MUSTANG BUDS

Mustang Buds is a great mentorship program with the Natrona County High School football team. The varsity team comes to the Club each Thursday during the football season to spend time with Club members. The Buds show up wearing their game jerseys, and our Club members are very excited to see them!

The Buds help Club members create art projects, do homework, play pool and foosball in the games room, and play games in the gymnasium. The Buds also interact with kids in the Susie McMurry Technology Center.

Many of the Buds are former Club members, and you can often see them showing each other the pictures of when they were younger and attended the Club. Many of these Buds started their football careers playing in the elementary flag football league. It is great to see many of our former members as high school athletes, being *Game Changers* by giving back to our current members, who really look up to them.



## WOLVERINE BUDS

This year, we started the Buds program in Riverton with the Riverton Wolverines. The Wolverine Buds program ran for 6 weeks with several football players attending each week. All involved greatly enjoyed it, and both players and Club members look forward to continuing the Wolverine Buds program next year.

School principal, Kent Thompson, received a

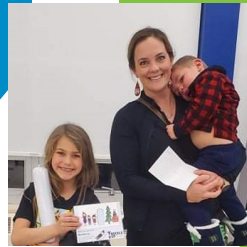
National Service to Youth Award for 5 years of service.

The Boys & Girls Club of Glenrock celebrated the opening of its new building, culminating the Brighter Futures for Glenrock Youth Campaign.



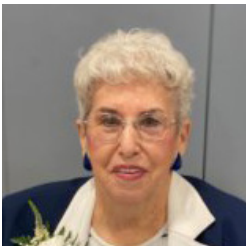

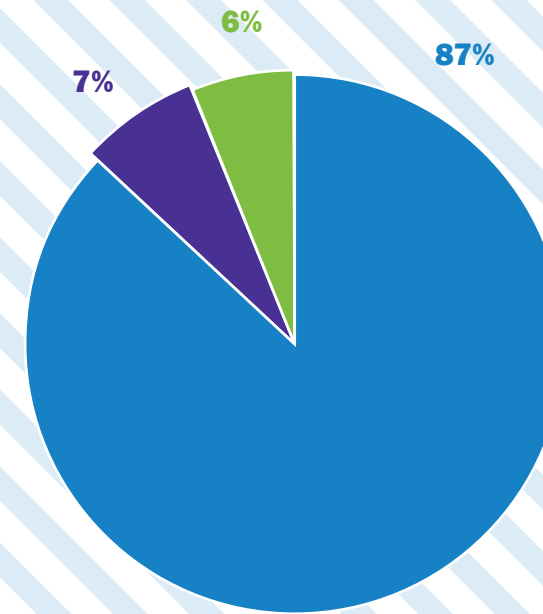

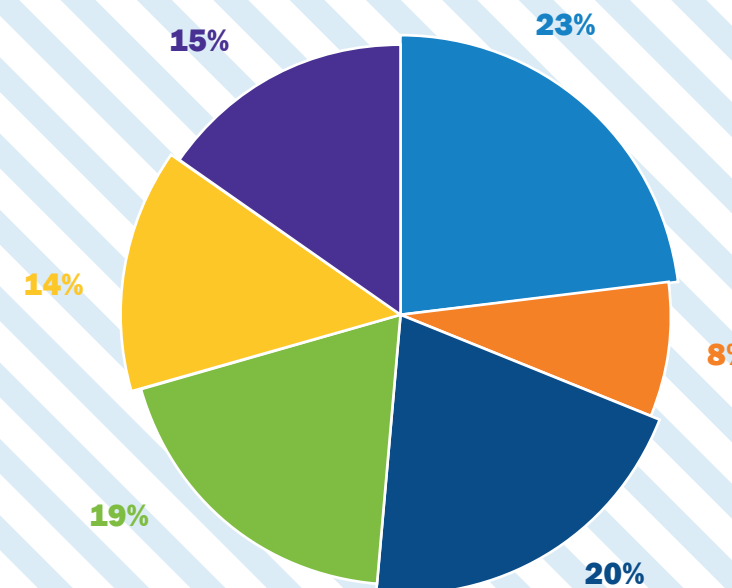
